8th International Evidence Based Library and Information Practice Conference awarded to Brisbane, Australia for 2015
EBLIP8, the eighth in the successful series of international conferences to promote evidence based approaches to library and information practice, has been awarded to Brisbane, Australia to take place in 2015. The Australian bid vied with two strong competitors to secure the votes of the international selection committee. Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, Canada, January 9th, 2013 * The International Advisory Committee (IAC) for the International Evidence Based Library and Information Practice Conference Series [1] has awarded the EBLIP8 Conference to Brisbane, Australia [2]. The Brisbane bid was coordinated by Helen Partridge, a Professor in the Systems Information School at the Queensland University of Technology, Australia [3]. Criteria for selection included the location, facilities, regional and national support, the strength of the organizing team, and unique selling points.

Brisbane was commended for the overall quality of its proposal including a good understanding of the requirements of the conference and excellent support for the EBLIP movement. This article is very interesting. While it is about validating the instrument for analyzing the webpages, they found that only 14% of the website gave a correct diagnosis. Seventy percent came up with the diagnosis as part of a differential. It sort of scares me that many medical students and other healthcare students might use search engines to find differentials. One implication is that patients who bring in webpages may actually hold the appropriate differential in their internet printout. Physicians might consider that information. The article is NOT an open access journal. The abstract does not discuss the findings of accuracy since they were testing the scoring system.

The IOM definition has too many quality improvement connotations, in my opinion. Not QI is bad, but there could be a serious debate about the difference between research v. QI v. EBP (at least at my institution).

I'm glad to hear is considering that there are now new kinds of articles in JMLA that are not accounted for in the credentialing guidelines. For instance, I just submitted my AHIP application and one of my publications in JMLA is a new form called a Research Report. I put it with point values corresponding with a brief communication to be on the safe side, although the type of article has the word "research" in the title. I have some context for it because I was on JMLA's editorial board when the changes were made but I imagine it'd be very confusing for others applying for AHIP. There are no longer brief communications in JMLA; there are letters to the editor, editorials, case studies, research reports, systematic reviews, and full-length papers. Perhaps the credentialing committee can revise their guidelines to address the new JMLA article categories, and also the Research Section could take JMLA's descriptions into account while drawing up their own definition.

It depends on the institution. I am on the IRB for UT Medical Center. We review Stage III drug and diagnostic trials and do a lot of expedited reviews. Some proposals require a lot of revision but most are approved.

It is definitely a learning process. For our nurses in a Magnet environment, we have a Nursing Research Guide, a PhD nurse advisor, and a nurse member on the IRB. The nursing research proposal must first pass Nursing Research Council before going to institutional IRB. It?s a good model, since most nurses are unfamiliar with the research process.
