Dear Section Council members,

The 2016 conference will be held in Toronto, Ontario, Canada. It is a joint conference between 3 groups: MLA, CHLA/ABSC (Canadian Health Libraries Association-Association des biblioth?ques de la sant? du Canada) and ICLC (International Clinical Librarian Conference). The Program Committee for this 2016 meeting was charged to come up with a method of attracting, evaluating, and selecting member-contributed content (papers, posters, lightning talks, panels, and section-invited speakers) that equally included members from all 3 groups.

Our biggest challenge is that the planning timeline must be moved up. Members of all 3 organizations will need at least 6 months between notification of acceptance and the start of the conference to obtain permission and funding from their institutions and to obtain passports. Hi everyone.

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My comment was that, as hospital librarians, we likely aren't getting authorship on publications when we probably should be. I know from my own experience I am not and I've finally started saying something about it. I encouraged my class to also speak up for themselves if they know they're doing significant work for someone who is writing, publishing, presenting, etc. That's when one of them said that she would like to see the Research Section and MLA partner with ALA and put out a joint statement TO THE AMA on the importance of librarians and authorship. She thought it may be an effective way to have more clinicians realize and appreciate how much work we do, as opposed to bench or more traditional researchers who often have a different type of relationship with the library and (I suspect) are more likely to include librarian as an authors. She also thought it may reinforce the fact that having a librarian as an author lends extra weight to the article since it is more likely to have a thorough background search done first.

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Regardless, what do you guys think? Should we approach this, and if so, how? Should it be an agenda item at the business meeting at MLA?

I agree that a statement by the Research Section and MLA would be useful. I also think that what Heather is doing to encourage librarians to speak out is even more important. I have found that a few clinicians will think to ask if I would like authorship, but for the most part, they do not understand our role in that area. If we do not ask, they may never understand. It's up to us individually to point out our contributions and ask for recognition. I have never been turned down for authorship when I have requested it, but I only request it when I feel I have contributed substantially to a work.

We need to keep in mind that authorship criteria is different tin different areas and from one journal to another. So we may be denied authorship by one journal and accepted by another. The ICMJE below includes acquisition of data, while similar Harvard standards do not. Either way, as an author, the librarian should be ready to take full responsibility for the manuscript, which means we should be involved in final approval and editing. The ICMJE recommends that authorship be based on the following 4 criteria: * Substantial contributions to the conception or design of the work; or the acquisition, analysis, or interpretation of data for the work; AND * Drafting the work or revising it critically for important intellectual content; AND

* Final approval of the version to be published; AND

* Agreement to be accountable for all aspects of the work in ensuring that questions related to the accuracy or integrity of any part of the work are appropriately investigated and resolved.

Authorship - Harvard Medical School

1. Everyone who is listed as an author should have made a substantial, direct, intellectual contribution to the work. For example (in the case of a research report) they should have contributed to the conception, design, analysis and/or interpretation of data. Honorary or guest authorship is not acceptable. Acquisition of funding and provision of technical services, patients, or materials, while they may be essential to the work, are not in themselves sufficient contributions to justify authorship.

2. Everyone who has made substantial intellectual contributions to the work should be an author. Everyone who has made other substantial contributions should be acknowledged.

3. When research is done by teams whose members are highly specialized, individuals' contributions and responsibility may be limited to specific aspects of the work.

4. All authors should participate in writing the manuscript by reviewing drafts and approving the final version.

5. One author should take primary responsibility for the work as a whole even if he or she does not have an in-depth understanding of every part of the work.

6. This primary author should assure that all authors meet basic standards for authorship and should prepare a concise, written description of their contributions to the work, which has been approved by all authors. This record should remain with the sponsoring department.

I?m coming late to this conversation, but thought I would add something to the other thoughtful comments made here. Even if you are only providing extensive or even systematic searches for a project, then I think it would be worth asking if the project team could use a librarian/author to sort through the searching process with them, who could contribute to the analysis of the literature and write parts of the final paper, especially the methodology sections. If the answer is no, then the process stops. However, the recent focus on systematic reviews has helped highlight the importance of librarians as authors (see, for example, the AHRQ statement at http://effectivehealthcare.ahrq.gov/ehc/products/60/318/CER-Methods-Guide-140109.pdf), but my sense from talking to researchers is that this is still a fairly novel idea. I think most researchers have generally never considered

fairly novel idea. I think most researchers have generally never considere the possibility of including a librarian on their teams, but might if the suggestion were made. So, I would say, if you are interested in participating as a team member and think you can contribute as an author, ask.

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My comment was that, as hospital librarians, we likely aren?t getting authorship on publications when we probably should be. I know from my own experience I am not and I?ve finally started saying something about it. I encouraged my class to also speak up for themselves if they know they?re doing significant work for someone who is writing, publishing, presenting, etc. That?s when one of them said that she would like to see the Research Section and MLA partner with ALA and put out a joint statement TO THE AMA on the importance of librarians and authorship. She thought it may be an effective way to have more clinicians realize and appreciate how much work we do, as opposed to bench or more traditional researchers who often have a different type of relationship with the library and (I suspect) are more likely to include librarians as authors. She also thought it may reinforce the fact that having a librarian as an author lends extra weight to the article since it is more likely to have a thorough background search done first.

extensive or even systematic searches for a project, then I think it would be worth asking if the project team could use a librarian/author to sort through the searching process with them, who could contribute to the analysis of the literature and write parts of the final paper, especially the methodology sections. If the answer is no, then the process stops. However, the recent focus on systematic reviews has helped highlight the importance of librarians as authors (see, for example, the AHRQ statement at http://effectivehealthcare.ahrq.gov/ehc/products/60/318/CER-Methods-Guide-140109.pdf), but my sense from talking to researchers is that this is still a fairly novel idea. I think most researchers have generally never considered the possibility of including a librarian on their teams, but might if the suggestion were made.

So, I would say, if you are interested in participating as a team member and think you can contribute as an author, ask.

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A way to address this question is to consult the ICMJE guidelines for defining authorship:

The National Center for Health Statistics http://www.cdc.gov/nchs/index.htm announces the release of Health, United States, 2014. Health, United States is the annual report on the health status of the nation, compiled by the National Center for Health Statistics and submitted by the Secretary of Health and Human Services to the President and Congress. Each year, Health, United States examines an important health topic and this year's special feature explores the health of the 55-64 age group. This group was born during the height of the Baby Boom and will become Medicare eligible over the next 10 years. The feature compares their health to those who were 55-64 years old a decade ago. Adults aged 55-64 are entering a period of life increasingly influenced by chronic conditions, which are the leading causes of death and disability in the United States. Among the highlights:

* Current 55-64 year olds are more racially diverse than a decade earlier with non-Hispanic white persons comprising almost 75%, non-Hispanic black persons about 11% and Hispanic persons almost 10%.
* In 2009-2012 the prevalence of diabetes was close to 19%, the prevalence of obesity was about 40% and the prevalence of hypertension was just over 51% among 55-64 year olds, unchanged from a decade earlier.

* In 2012-2013, adults aged 55-64 living below 100% of poverty were nearly three times as likely to be current smokers as those at 400% or more of poverty (32.4% vs 11.2%).

* In 2009-2012, nearly half (45%) of adults aged 55-64 took a prescription cardiovascular drug, and 15% used a prescription analgesic, similar to levels a decade earlier.

The report also features detailed tables and charts displaying health statistics trends over time on: birth and death rates, infant mortality, life expectancy, morbidity and health status, risk factors, use of ambulatory and inpatient care, health personnel and facilities, financing of health care, health insurance and managed care, and other health topics. A variety of resources can be found on the Health, United States webpage, including the full report featuring a chartbook and trend tables. A special abridged edition, Health, United States, 2014: In Brief http://www.cdc.gov/nchs/hus.htm is also available as a companion to the full report.

Online training on how to conduct reviews will occur on August 18th from 2-3 pm Eastern Time. We are conducting a research study exploring the value of journal club participation for librarians.
