This text considers radiotherapy planning in the larger context of multidisciplinary treatment planning. It emphasizes the knowledge of anatomy, spread patterns, and proper staging techniques which are essential before specific radiotherapy planning can begin. It contains

detailed reviews of the anatomic milieu and of spread review. The text is written partially in a "branching" format, which allows the reader to make choices among given alternative radiotherapy plans and to learn the consequences of those choices.
