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MORNING REPORT

WHAT IS MORNING REPORT?

- Can refer to different things
 - Table rounds where teams present their patients to the attending and discuss next steps
 - Didactic conference where one person presents a recent case step-by-step
 - sometimes referred to as “case conference” or Grand Rounds
- *We call our 3x weekly case-style internal medicine conference “morning report”*
- Who’s there?
- What happens?
- How can the librarian be involved?

HELPFUL TIPS

Equipment

iPad or laptop is most helpful

Things to consider:

- Are you telling the group what you found in the moment?
- Will you send out copies of the articles or links to the literature after?

Follow Up Searching

1. Guidelines
2. Reviews
3. Similar cases
4. Answers to questions in an evidence summary with useful literature

How will you communicate your findings and literature to the group?

VIRTUAL MORNING REPORT

- Perfect if your sessions are being conducted fully or partially over Zoom
- The chat is your best friend!
- No need to talk, just add links to relevant literature or comments
- Communicate your plan to the attending/faculty before so they know to check the chat
- Follow up with those links in a later email
